Prospective homebuyers like what they see at HighPointe at Woodbury Junction

Anew, fully decorated model home officially opened its doors to the public last weekend during the Grand Opening of HighPointe at Woodbury Junction. The collection of 25 single-family homes is rising in the HighPointe section of the well-established Woodbury Junction neighborhood in Monroe-Woodbury, N.Y.

"The award-winning Monroe Woodbury Central School District is another big draw for families," Hornblass said. "We carefully chose this location so that families could be near their places of employment and still enjoy a comfortable environment for raising their children in a community where kids can actually walk to school. There are numerous parks, hiking trails and other forms of outdoor recreation in the area. The town's 'Woodbury Rec' program provides swimming, boating, day camps, fishing, sports fields and other programs for children of all ages."
